Dear Sponsors and Individual Members:

Enclosed you will find everything you need to begin preparations to attend the 50th Annual KJHS Conference on **April 27-28, 2012** at the Thomas D. Clark Center for Kentucky History campus and the Capital Plaza Hotel, both located in downtown Frankfort. Information about lodging at the Capital Plaza or other Frankfort hotels is included in this packet.

Please be aware that all sign-up sheets and nomination forms (other than officer nominations) **must** be into the state office by **March 30, 2012**. I encourage you to have your students turn their information in to you at least two weeks in advance of our deadline. This will ensure that school cancellations, flu season, and other common winter and spring delays will not impact your club's participation.

Sign-Up Information

- Students wishing to share a **Performance** or **Kentucky Heritage Performance** will be provided time on Saturday, April 28. Weather permitting; a performance stage will be set up at the Old State Capitol steps so that all attendees may enjoy the performances.
- **Kentucky History Bowl, Kentucky History Test, and Impromptu Composition:** Due to scheduling issues students may **not** enter both History Bowl and Impromptu Composition. Please use the enclosed forms to sign up individual students for each of these competitions. Please note the Kentucky History Test will be administered on Saturday, April 28.
- The **Chapter Challenge** category will be displayed in Commonwealth Hall and judged on Friday, **April 27**. We encourage all clubs to enter an exhibit or documentary to show what your club has accomplished this school year. Please see the enclosed form.

Other Reminders

- **Elementary teachers:** You are encouraged to have your 4th and 5th grade students enter the Kentucky History Day (KHD) Youth Division (see enclosed form). These projects will be judged and displayed at the History Center on Saturday, April 28.
- **State NHD Competition:** This will take place at the History Center on Saturday, April 28. Those eligible may register after their district competition takes place. All students who compete at district KHD contests, however, are invited and encouraged to take part in the entire KJHS Conference. Those who have not been involved in NHD competitions before will have the opportunity to view exhibits and attend performances and documentaries.
- **Friday workshops:** There is still time to propose a session for Friday afternoon. We are looking for sponsors and students within clubs who want to share a specific activity their club has engaged in over the past year with other club members. See enclosed form.
- **Special Activities:** Special tours and hands-on activities will be taking place throughout the day on both Friday and Saturday on the KHS history campus and in downtown Frankfort.
- **Dance:** This year the dance will be on Friday night, April 27, at the Capital Plaza Hotel (Caucus Room). All parents/teachers/sponsors are encouraged to attend. We hope to have a variety of games available as well. Stay tuned for more details.

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- **Officer Elections and Voting:** Please encourage your students to consider running for a KJHS board office. More positions are open now that more districts have been added and lines redrawn (see enclosed nomination form). This year, speeches will take place at the Old State Capitol at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 28, and voting will take place in the Education classrooms from 12:00 p.m. - 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 28.
- **Amendment voting:** The KJHS board has advised that the due date for club enrollment be changed. You will have the opportunity to vote on this at the conference.
- **Awards Ceremony:** All awards and election results will be announced on Saturday, April 28 at a special awards ceremony at the Grand Theatre on St. Clair Street at starting at 3:00 p.m.

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Annual KJHS Awards List

Presented at conference awards ceremony, Saturday, April 28, 2012

KJHS Achievement Award

This award will be presented to a long-term member of KJHS who has exhibited more than one year of exceptional leadership and involvement with his/her local chapter (or as an individual member), and has had award-winning projects for multiple years. To be nominated, a member must be in good standing with his/her chapter and the KJHS. Clubs may nominate as many members as qualify for this award; individual members may also be nominated.

Outstanding KJHS Member

This award will be presented to the member of KJHS who exhibits exceptional leadership and involvement in his/her local chapter. It is **not** limited to local or state officers. The award will be given based on the nomination form, which must be signed by the club sponsor. A club may nominate **one person** for this award. The member must be in good standing with his/her chapter and the state KJHS.

Outstanding Board Member

This award will be presented to the KJHS board member who exhibits exceptional leadership as a state officer.

Chapter of the Year

This award will be presented to an **established** chapter of KJHS that has exhibited the greatest activity, dedication, and involvement with KJHS over the past year. The winner will be selected based on the annual club reports.

Rookie of the Year

This award will be presented to a **new** KJHS chapter that has exhibited the greatest activity, dedication, and involvement with KJHS over the past year. The winner will be selected based on the annual club reports.

Sponsor of the Year

Local club officers and members may choose to nominate their sponsor for this award. Judging will be based on the sponsor's promotion of club activities, demonstration of leadership skills, and dedication to furthering KJHS's purposes.

Membership Award

The Membership Award will be presented to the chapter that has been responsible for organizing the largest number of new KJHS chapters during the school year or has had the greatest increase in club membership. The winner will be selected based on the annual club reports.

Chapter Challenge

This award will be given to the club with the best exhibit or documentary that highlights their club's accomplishments for the 2011-2012 year.

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Kentucky History Bowl Rules 2012

Responsibility for knowing and following these rules as published belongs to the competing team members and their coaches.

1. The competition will take place on three levels: Youth, Junior (grades 6-8), and Senior (grades 9-12).
2. Teams will consist of four members and one alternate, with one member being designated as captain. The alternate may be substituted at the break between rounds or during a time-out. Only four members may compete at one time.
3. Questions will cover the following subject areas: Kentucky history, geography, politics, government, famous people, current events, and trivia.
4. The rules for the competition are as follows:
 - Each question will be worth one point for a correct answer. There will be no penalty for no answer or for an incorrect answer. The competition will be conducted in two rounds. Each round will consist of seven minutes or fifty questions, whichever is completed first. Each team is permitted one 60-second time-out each round. Teams may make one substitution during the competition, either during a time-out or during half-time.
 - After the question has been read, each team will have five seconds to buzz in. (A team may buzz in before the question has been read in entirety, but if the answer is incorrect, they forfeit the right to hear the full question.) The team member who buzzed in must answer immediately upon being recognized by the moderator. If the team member recognized does not immediately answer, the moderator will call the team for hesitation, and the question will be given to the other team.
 - Each team must wait to be recognized before beginning an answer.
 - After buzzing in, team members may not confer with one another.
 - If the first team to buzz in answers incorrectly, the moderator will repeat the question and the other team have the chance to answer under the same time limits – five seconds to buzz in with no hesitation.
 - If a question is answered correctly before the moderator finished it, the moderator will read it in its entirety for the benefit of the audience.
 - If no team buzzes in to answer a question, there will be no loss or awarding of points. The moderator will advance to the next question after giving the correct answer.
 - Following the final question, the team with the highest number of points will be declared the winner. Should a tie occur, five additional questions worth one point each will be asked.
 - Buzzers can be either held in participants' hands or shall be flat on the table. If technical difficulties arise, the equipment operator will decide where the buzzers will be placed.

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5. Judges, moderators, and equipment operators will be provided by the Kentucky Historical Society for Kentucky History Bowl. Judges may not be in any way connected with either participating team. Judges will have copies of the questions and answers, and their decisions will be final.
6. Protests must be made by the coach or captain of the team. Such protests should be addressed to the moderator at the end of each round. The moderator, in turn, will file the protest with the judges, and the judges' decision will be final.
7. If a student competing in Kentucky History Bowl uses a cell phone or other electronic communication device during the match, it will be forfeited. If a device is not in use but creates a disturbance (ringing, etc.), it will be confiscated and returned after the match.

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Dear KJHS Sponsors:

The Kentucky Junior Historical Society will hold its 2012 Conference in conjunction with the Kentucky History Day state contest in Frankfort on April 27 and 28. On Friday, April 27, the KJHS conference hosts a series of workshops presented by teachers and students about local history education and service learning projects that have been undertaken during the school year. Both KJHS and KHD students are welcome and encouraged to participate in the conference by attending or presenting workshops.

To this end, the KJHS Student Board invites workshop proposals that:

- feature models and examples of best practices in service-learning in history-oriented activities;
- promote history appreciations among grades K-12 students;
- introduce ongoing projects to watch as they grow and progress;
- share tools for successful projects and partnerships; and
- dissect failed projects that everyone can learn from.

Proposals will focus on unique methods of developing, planning, and implementing local history projects, creating partnerships that further an appreciation of history and strengthening academic standards within grades K-12. What can we learn from your club as you work to:

- build club membership as greater demands are placed on teachers' and students' time;
- establish and nurture partnerships with local businesses, community organizations, historical societies, and colleges and universities;
- show the impact that KJHS has on student academic achievement;
- leverage limited financial resources to have the largest possible impact on the community;
- deliver a new history resource;
- connect personal and community histories to state history; and
- market your club to your school and community;

Requirements

Each session must have a sponsor responsible for organizing speakers and coordinating logistics. All sponsors must be affiliated with a KJHS club in good standing. Topics for sessions should fall into at least one of the categories listed on page one of the Proposal Form.

Proposals must be submitted on the official Request for Proposals form. You may submit the form via email, fax, or mail. For more information about the Kentucky Junior Historical Society or the Kentucky Historical Society, visit the KHS website, <http://history.ky.gov>, or contact Cheryl Caskey at Cheryl.Caskey@ky.gov or by phone at 502-564-1792, ext. 4461.

Select a Topic: Participating in the KJHS Conference is an effective way to share your ideas, encourage discussion of significant issues, and earn recognition among your peers across the state.

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- 1) **Format:** currently KJHS only accepts sessions in the workshop format. A **Workshop** teaches special skills in a small group setting. Your proposal should specify the particular skills the workshop will teach, as well as the methods and techniques instructors will use. All workshops are 50 minutes long.
- 2) **Sponsor and Panelists:** Every workshop must have a sponsor who is responsible for the organization and management of the workshop including logistics, requests for materials and equipment, communication with participants and KHS staff, and leading the session itself. All workshop sponsors must be affiliated with a KJHS club and participants must be KJHS members.
- 3) **Session Proposal Form:** Each proposal must include a completed proposal form, a list that identifies the workshop sponsor and participants, a fifty word description of the session that will be used to describe the workshop in the conference program, and a 125 word abstract that outlines the workshop's content.
- 4) **Submission: Submit your proposal via email, fax, or mail by the deadline (March 30, 2012) to Cheryl Caskey at KHS. Workshop sponsors will be notified of their proposal's status by April 13, 2012.**
- 5) **Registration Fees & Cost:** All workshop sponsors and participants must register for the KJHS conference. KJHS does not pay travel costs or honoraria for any workshop participants. Workshop sponsors are responsible for making sure that all participants register for the conference.
- 6) **Scheduled Sessions:** KHS staff will assign all session times and dates. Submission of a proposal indicates your willingness to accept the schedule as assigned. You may submit a request for a specific date or time; however we cannot guarantee that we can honor all requests.
