

GOVERNOR'S AWARD AND KHS BOOKS

Governor's Award

Established in 1979, the Governor's Award is given every four years in the last year of a governor's term to the author whose book has been judged by a panel of scholars to have made the most significant contribution to Kentucky history. It is presented jointly by the Office of the Governor and the Kentucky Historical Society. The winners of this distinguished award are given below.
